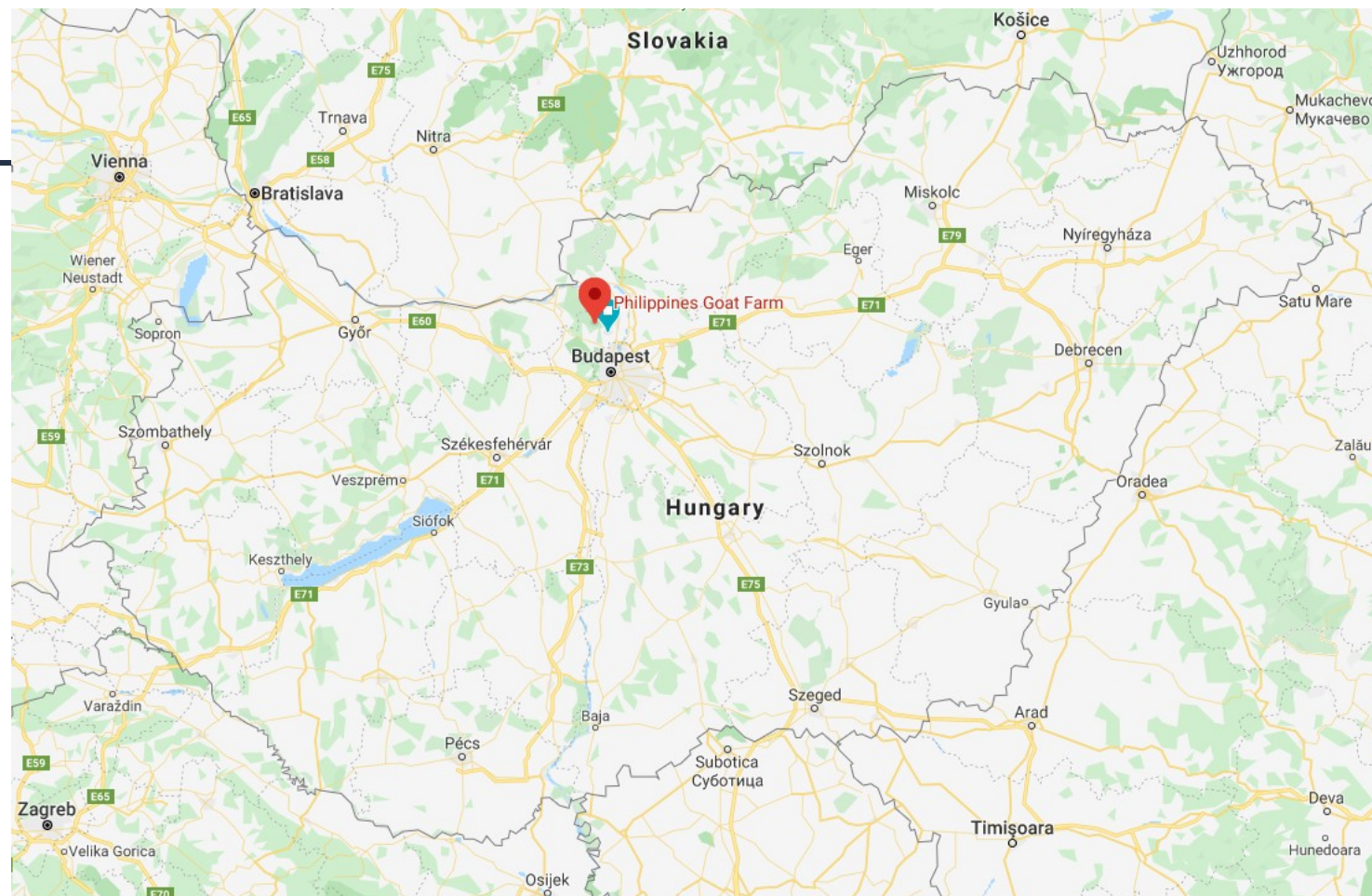
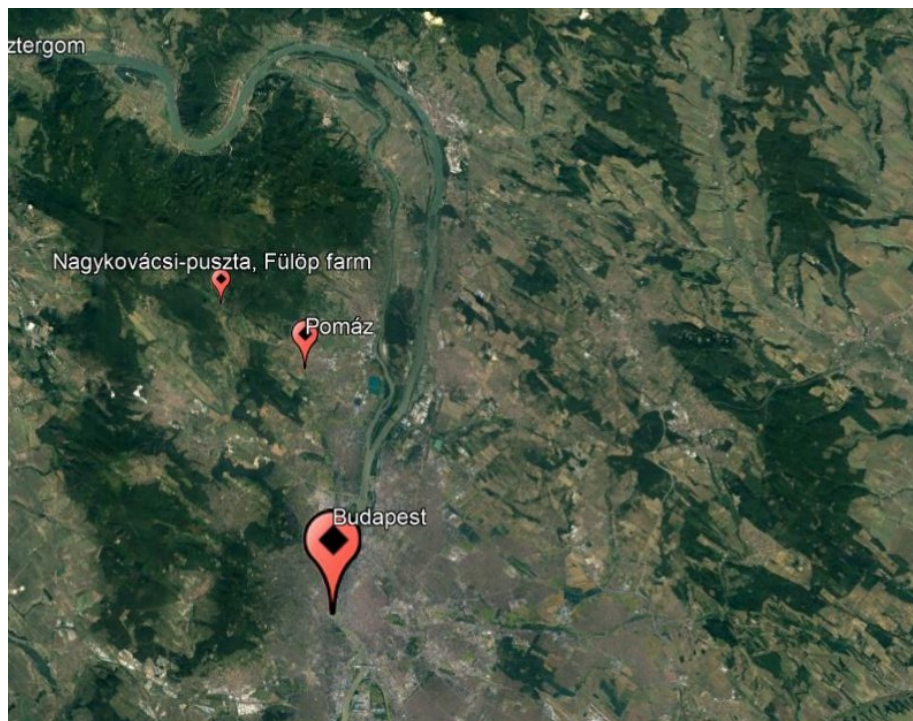

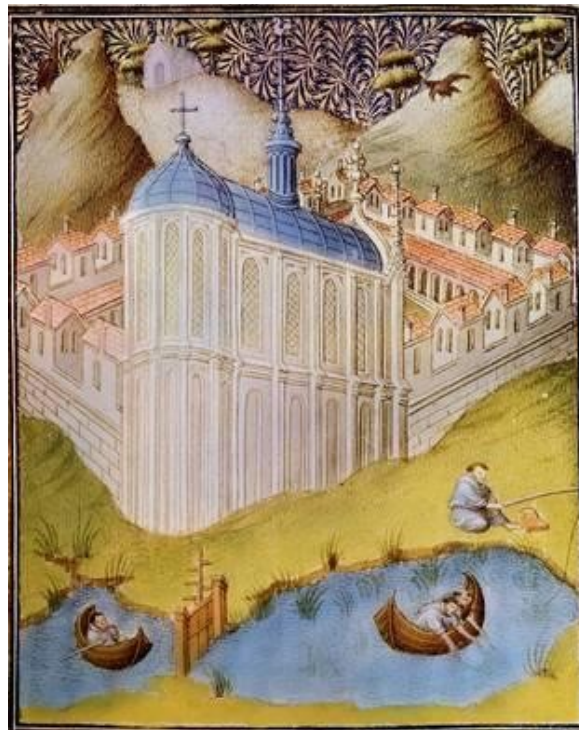

MISSION:


To turn the complex environmental and cultural heritage site into an accessible place for various groups of audience attracted by the heritage values of the site, by co-operating in the interpretation and presentation of the site with these groups, in a way which can also contribute to the sustainability of the farm where it is located.

OBJECTIVES

1. Create visitor-friendly conditions and spaces
2. Identify the existing and potential heritage communities around the site
3. Explore potential management structures for the site
4. Explore potential financial models for the site
5. Build co-operation with local institutions using the concepts of local historical heritage
6. Create a broader community around the site – using on-line tools
7. Integrate the site into the regional heritage routes, network of sites
8. Incorporate the Lab into higher educational curricula on cultural heritage, spatial planning, and architectural planning



The site is currently running in test mode.

The Local Heritage List is a database where special items of cultural, architectural, industrial, agricultural, touristic etc. heritage can be entered. Every settlement, region, and county can create and manage its own list, which is usually administered by local NGOs. Anyone can propose a heritage item; the proposal is reviewed and its acceptance or rejection is decided by the Local Heritage List Committee, set up and commissioned by the municipal government.

The proposals are in Hungarian.

The following items have already been accepted as elements of the local heritage of Pomáz:

1. Roofed gates
2. Crosses
3. The "Trianon" Double Cross

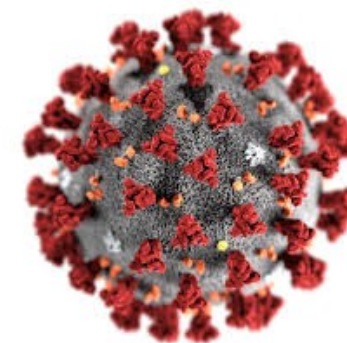
